

The OfS and data returns

The Office for Students

- Formerly HEFCE until April 2018
- Increased regulatory responsibilities & Register
- Same teaching funding responsibilities as HEFCE until 2019-20

In 2017-18 and 2018-19

- OfS funds Further Education and Sixth Form College (FECs) and Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)
- Other HE providers can complete Unistats and apply for TEF
- In 2019-20
- All HE providers apply for Registration to be funded in 2019-20, for student support designation or Tier 4

Funding data returns

ILR R14 data submitted to the ESFA in October (academic year end)

- Individualised student data for prescribed higher education courses
- Student characteristics used for some funding allocations
- The OfS will reconcile against HEIFES data for same year and could result in audit or reconciliation of funding

HEIFES submitted to us by colleges in November each year

- Report student numbers in current academic year in aggregated categories (spreadsheet).
- volume measure for the following year's funding.

Apprenticeships

- Reported in ILR data
- HE fields completed for recognised higher education (more later)
- For OfS-funded providers, recognised HE qualifications reported in HEIFES or HESES and funded in same way as other HE
- Submitted to ESFA

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OfS funding streams – for colleges

High cost subject funding:

- for courses in more costly subjects, identified through price groups B & C1.
- · Calculated from HEIFES data for the previous year.

Targeted allocations informed by ILR data:

Student premium (full-time and part-time allocations)

- supporting undergraduates who are more at risk of withdrawing
- ILR data on age, qualification aim, entry qualifications, and postcodes

Disabled students' premium

- · recruiting and supporting disabled students
- ILR data on DSA and self-declared disability

2017-18 ILR data likely to be used for 2019-20 funding HEIFES data checked against ILR data for the same year

Unistats

Official website to search for and compare data and information on higher education courses

Core information is Unistats data set (formerly KIS) which includes:

- National Student Survey (NSS) data student satisfaction
- Student destinations on finishing their course from Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education (DLHE) survey
- How the course is assessed
- Course accreditation



Unistats and the ILR

- 2018 Unistats data uses some 2017-18 ILR data
- Students on recognised higher education courses
- Continuation rates identified using various ILR fields
- Information on mode, course level, type and year
- ILR generates target list of students to be included in NSS and DLHE surveys
- Data checking tool



Teaching Excellence and Student Outcomes Framework (TEF) and the ILR

- TEF is to recognise and reward excellent learning and teaching
- Outcomes are published and inform maximum fee levels
- ILR data used for TEF
- For TEF metrics (non-continuation, student satisfaction, and employment/study)
- · Level, mode, where taught, subject, background, disability
- Implications of TEF being wrong: inaccurate outcome

Amendments to data

- We will not automatically accept data amendments: errors in data will be assessed by an OfS panel
- · Panel decides if amendments are required
- To be required, amendments must be widespread and significant with material impact on our use of the data.
- Amendments may be used for one purpose, not all
- Get it right first time
